

As they came together in 1926 for a day of prayer in support missions and ministries, it didn't take long for other nations to hear of it and want to join with them in prayer. 1927 was the first International World Day of Prayer. Each year a country is chosen to share their hopes for the future and their needs in the present. This year, the country is Nigeria and Christian women there have prepared the service for countries all around the world to join in prayer for their needs and the needs of our world. World Day of Prayer encompasses 150 nations, 90 languages and about 1.5 million people uniting hearts in prayer.
