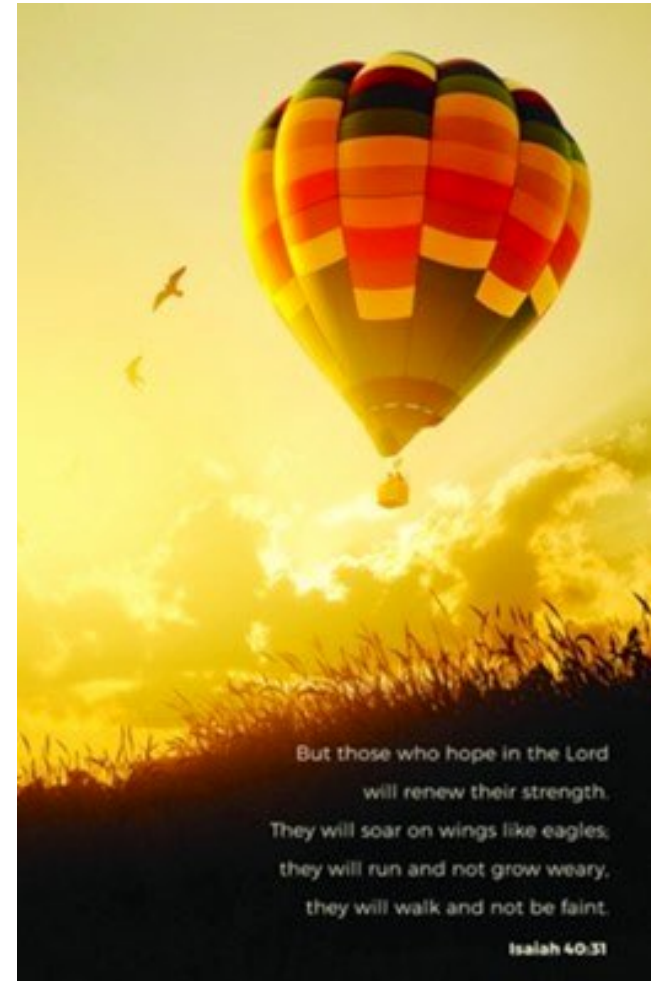

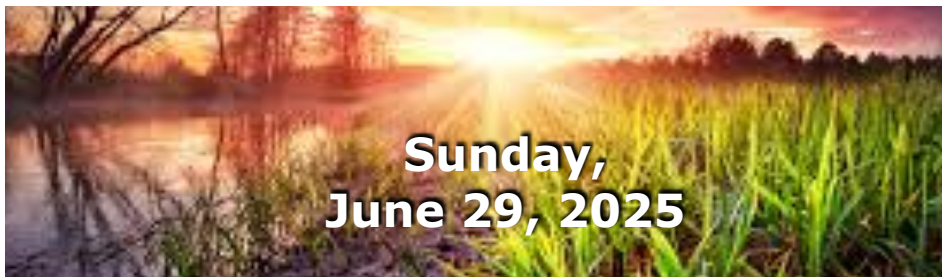

### 1 Kings 19: 19-21
